HO 98: ASBESTOS
November 15, 1990

Indefinite

All records relating to production use, purchase or sale of asbestos or asbestos products, including but not limited to:

1. Mining, milling or production of asbestos, including records with respect to employees or others who worked at any Union Carbide mining, milling or production site.
- ② Purchase or acquisition of asbestos or asbestos products which contained asbestos.
- ③ Use of asbestos or products which contained asbestos in or with Union Carbide buildings, facilities or equipment.
4. Asbestos as a Union Carbide product or products of Union Carbide which contained asbestos, including:
 - Formulations
 - Product Development and Testing
 - Quality Control
 - Containment or release of fibers
 - Inquiries and responses
5. Exposure of Union Carbide employees or employees of others on Union Carbide premises, including:
 - Policies, guidelines and practices
 - Dust counts
- ⑥ Medical examinations of Union Carbide or non-Union Carbide persons exposed to asbestos or products or materials which contained asbestos, including:
 - Policies, guidelines and practices
 - Records of medical examinations
 - Communications to persons examined
 - Memoranda or notes

O = Circled items are potential Texas City Plant exposure areas for pertinent documents.

- ⑦ Medical effects and health and safety aspects of asbestos, including:

 - Books or articles
 - Tests or studies
 - Inquiries and responses
 - Toxicology or epidemiology
 - Internal memoranda or notes
8. Labels, instructions or packaging for asbestos as a Union Carbide product or Union Carbide products which contained asbestos.
9. Advertising or promotional materials with respect to asbestos as a Union Carbide product or Union Carbide products which contained asbestos.
10. Union Carbide material safety data sheets or precautionary materials for asbestos as a Union Carbide Product or Union Carbide products which contained asbestos, including the providing of same to customers or others.
11. Sales of asbestos as a Union Carbide product or products of Union Carbide which contained asbestos, including:

 - Communications to and from customers
 - Call reports
 - Sales and shipments
- ⑫ Disposal of asbestos or products or materials which contained asbestos.
- ⑬ Remediation of asbestos or materials which contained asbestos at Union Carbide facilities.
14. Regulatory compliance.
15. Accidents and near misses.
16. Litigation and claims brought by Union Carbide employees (including workers' compensation,) customers, employees or others.

This Hold Order is not intended to diminish the documents which relate to asbestos which have been and are being retained pursuant to Hold Order 43 or advice or guidance which has been provided by counsel or appropriate Union Carbide personnel. Until further notice, these records must be retained and must not be destroyed.
