Because of the importance and significance of this report we have secured extra copies, one of which is enclosed for your use. This report will probably not be superseded for several years, and the study methodology used herein will undoubtedly be the pattern for future work of this nature.

At the recent USPHS Symposium on Lead held in Washington (see our Bulletin No. 165 dated January 19, 1966) the conclusions reached in the report were questioned by some but no data was brought forth that contradicted that which was so painstakingly gathered and which is so thoroughly presented in this document.

We think you will find this report useful as the definitive word to date on the subject of lead in the atmosphere. We have extra copies available for our members.

For your information we list the members of the Special Subcommittee on Air and Water Pollution of the Committee on Public Works of the U. S. Senate. As you know, Senator Muskie has announced that this committee will hold hearings on lead.
