I'm a journalist writing a story for Mother Jones about community relocation due to extreme weather. I understand that the EPA was involved in an interagency working group on this subject. I have also obtained via FOIA the Memorandum of Understanding regarding "community-led managed retreat and voluntary relocation."

I am requesting comment on the following questions:

- Since the MoU was signed in December 2016/January 2017 what work has the EPA done on its goals for this plan?
- As the MoU outlines, the group should meet every other month. In addition, it states that within 9 months of signing the MoU, an "action plan" should be developed. Has the EPA met these deadlines? If yes, can you please provide a status update as to where the project currently sits. If no, please explain why not.
