According to Mr. Long's Bulletin 50, May 26, 1972, all Glidden Industrial products must comply with FDA Regulations by September 30, 1972.

The products sold last year in each territory at Central Region have been reviewed by the respective salesmen and a report made of the specific end use.

Some end use categories were obviously not under regulation by the FDA and could contain lead pigments. Where there was any reason for doubt we have asked our Legal Department for an opinion.

They have given us the following items in which lead will be permitted:

- Garden Tools
- Snow Plows
- Lawn Mowers
- Wheelbarrows
- Trail Bikes (Gasoline Powered)
- Dune Buggies
- Furnaces
- Air Conditioners
- Window Furnace/ Air Conditioners
- Ventilator Registers
- Heating Registers
- Steel Partitions (Schools)
- Steel Partitions (Offices)
- Bank Fixtures
- Fire-proof Filing Cabinets
- Hospital Furniture
- Electric Switch Boxes
- Office Furniture
- Desks
- Residential Siding (OK now, may change)
- Color Card Chips
- Sanitary Gel-Kote

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The next list of items are those under regulation and must conform according to FDA, to less than .5% Lead by December 31, 1973.2.

Residential Metal Furniture

Residential Cabinets

Fiberglass Products in contact with food

Can and Bottle Closures (Exterior)
