Dear Mr. Kehe:

I have been requested by our Mr. D. H. Bechtold to provide you with some information concerning our product Aroclor 5460. First, Aroclor 5460 is a polychlorinated ter phenyl as opposed to a polychlorinated bi phenyl. Therefore it is not effected by our withdrawal of PCB's from the market place. We fully intend to continue sales of this material. Second, Aroclor 5460 does not appear to display the toxic character that is exhibited by some of the PCB's, particularly Aroclor 1254 and Aroclor 1260. Further, in spite of persistent attempts to identify this material in the environment, we have not been able to do so. This is in sharp contrast to our ability to isolate and identify PCB's. For these reasons, we do not believe that Aroclor 5460 fits into the category of an environmental contaminant.
