

1 MR. SMITH: 30th.

2 MR. IGNATOWSKI: 30th, 1952.

5 43 was received into evidence.)

6 MR. SMITH: This is offered both against
7 Owens-Illinois and Owens-Corning.

8 MR. IGNATOWSKI: Introduction. Before Kaylo
9 was used commercially on a large scale, it was
10 important to determine whether or not any dust
11 liberated from this product during manufacture,
12 handling, or fabrication would be likely to constitute
13 a respiratory hazard to exposed individuals.

15 MS. TOSTANOSKI: I just wanted the one

17 The investigation was started in February
18 1945 and was carried out for more than five years.
