Dear Sirs:

I am sorry I was not here to receive your telephone call on September 8, 1967 relative to laws or regulations requiring factory or in-plant lift trucks to be equipped with exhaust and/or crank case ventilation systems to control or limit toxic gases or vapors.

I have talked to Lt. Joe Wolfe of the State Highway Patrol, who interprets motor vehicle laws and he says he knows of no such Ohio law.

I also talked with the Ohio Secretary of State's office and they know of no such law---had the inquiry come to them, they would have referred it to us.

I also talked with Mr. Jack Wenderle in charge of air pollution for the Ohio Department of Health and he stated that the Federal Clean Air Act and regulations require no such devices, in his opinion, to apply to in-plant vehicles.
