Dear Tom:

Pursuant to the askarel section of the CIGRE meeting to be held in Paris, Sept. 5, 1972, the chairman Mr. E. H. Reynolds had already sent to me the proposed agenda, which you kindly attached to your letter.

Accordingly, I was already aware that much of the material supplied by Mr. Reynolds about PCB and the environment originated in the USA. There seems little need to add to this type material which is already voluminous.

Pursuant to your question, it would seem that the time is here for statements regarding the disposal of apparatus and PCBs from service or failed apparatus. While it is well known that Monsanto and others provide for the proper incineration of scrap PCB fluid, the handling and disposal of solid waste from capacitors and transformers has not yet been announced.

This will stem from our ANSI Committee C107 and will probably be published first by NEMA. But, until this has been cleared through our committees in the USA, I would not feel it proper to distribute it abroad.
