Claim OD 120032 - Roosevelt Cross
Asbestosis - June 22, 1962

At the hearing on October 5, 1962, this claim was allowed for permanent and total disability due to asbestosis. Compensation was awarded at the maximum rate of \$49.00 a week to begin June 23, 1962 and continue during the remainder of the claimant's life.

The claimant had worked for your company about 13 years, during the last 15 of which he was employed at work which would expose him to asbestos dust.

Before a claim of this type is allowed, the Bureau is required to have the claimant examined by an appropriate specialist. We assume that this was done and that the expert medical examination and opinion resulted in a diagnosis of asbestosis, causing permanent and total disability.

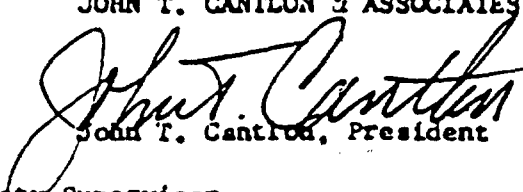
This claim will affect your company's experience for the next five years and initially will be charged at a cost of approximately \$16,000.00.

If medical expenses are high, or if a death claim results during the five-year period, the charge against this claim could reach the maximum of \$25,000.00.

The additional premium that will be paid because of this claim during the next five years will, therefore, range from \$20,000.00 to \$30,000.00.
