

839 New Industrial Nursing Courses at Yale.

For the past two years, thinking has been directed toward the establishment of an industrial nursing program at the Yale University School of Medicine. The Bureau of Industrial Hygiene of the Connecticut State Department of Health, in cooperation with Yale University School of Medicine, Institute of Occupational Medicine and Hygiene, announced that as of September 7, 1949, additional industrial nursing will be incorporated into the basic curriculum for professional nurses at the Yale School of Nursing, also in the Department of Public Health, and in the development of in-service training opportunities for nurses now in industry.

840 Color for Industrial Safety.

The Sectional Committee on Safety Color Code, 253, of the American Standards Association in cooperation with National Safety Council, has decided to revise for peacetime use the color code approved for wartime. In addition to the colors recommended, there has been some demand for the use of orange and blue for definite purposes, also for a violet or purple for radiation hazards. A chart accompanies the item, showing the colors recommended by other organizations. -- Standardization
