Subject: 1966 Program - Suggestions for Research

In the not too distant future, we will hold a series of Program Planning meetings to discuss ideas for incorporation in our 1966 research program. We would, therefore, invite your suggestions as to research which you feel should be conducted to expand our markets or to maintain our position in the market place. This should also include long range research for programs which might have technical as well as commercial significance.

As always we would urge that the suggestions be made in the form of a work statement which includes a review of the problem and the research proposed, recommending the scope of the research and the economic incentive. In the latter case, for long-term research, a guide or a potential is all that might be included.

We would urge that these suggestions be sent to us at your earliest opportunity or given to your own company representatives who are participants in our meetings.
