

With regard to retirees, pensioners, etc. our current policy is:

Special medical surveillance is required as long as employees are on exposed assignments. Upon transfer to a nonexposed assignment, retirement, or reduction of concentration below the action level, special medical surveillance cannot be legally required. However, continuing special medical surveillance for HMPA, acrylonitrile, and asbestos should be offered, and strongly recommended to the employee.

The revised T.F. Health Policy reflects the S&F guidelines on asbestos exposure and the policy on special medical surveillance.
