CHICAGO, Sept. 16 (AP)—Wheat strong; reports of more government buying. Corn moved up with wheat, except September lower. Oats little change. Hogs steady to 25 cents higher, top \$21.75. Cattle steady to 50 cents lower, top \$33.

WELLINGTON, N.Z., Sept. 16 (AP)—Prime Minister Peter Fraser told the house of representatives today that the longshoreman's union leader, Harry Bridges, had threatened to tie up Pacific shipping and that this amounted to a declaration of war on New Zealand.

"Let them try," he said. "Let anyone in this country try. We will deal with them with the utmost rigor of the law, and if that law is not sufficient, we will make it so."

Opposition Leader S. S. Holland said his party would help pass any legislation needed to deal with such a situation.
