Dear Doctor Kehoe:

I regret the delay in replying to your letter
of October 20.

The case you mention came to my attention
several years ago and at that time I made no
record of the patient's name or clinic number.
In searching through our files I have not been
able to locate the history under the index heading
of lead poisoning nor have I been able to find
any cross index which would give me a clue.

As I told Doctor Edgar in our conversation,
our impression at the time the patient was here
was that the nervous system symptoms were attribut-
able to tetra-ethyl lead. I am indeed sorry that
I cannot give you specific details as to the
findings and the clinical history.
