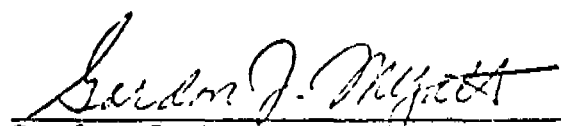
Subject: Certification of Record In the Matter of
