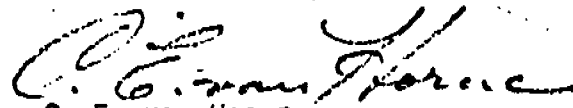
DEAR MR. STOKES:

THE FOLLOWING IS TO CONFIRM THE MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING REACHED, THIS
DATE IN OUR MEETING, REGARDING THE \$25 DEDUCTABLE REQUIREMENT WHICH
IS NOW IN EFFECT WITH OUR PRESENT INSURANCE CARRIER, BLUE CROSS/BLUE
SHIELD INSURANCE COMPANY.

IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT ALL EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE BEEN AFFECTED
BY THE INSURANCE PLAN NOW IN FORCE WILL BE REIMBURSED, AND ALSO ANY

DUCTABLE PLAN TO APPLY ONLY TO THE MEDICAL PART OF THE INSURANCE
COVERAGE.
