Dear Mr. Nizer:

The Union hereby requests that the Company initiate an asbestos removal program at the Paulsboro refinery. The Union seeks the removal of all asbestos insulation that either 1) has deteriorated or 2) is likely to be removed in the future for maintenance, an overhaul or for a turnaround. Where there is no likelihood that the asbestos insulation would ever have to be removed, such asbestos insulation could be encapsulated rather than removed. All asbestos removal (or encapsulation) must be completed by June 1, 1982.

The Union requests that this asbestos removal project be performed by a highly trained crew from within the bargaining unit. The crew must be trained on the methods of asbestos removal that generate the least amount of dust. Specifically, when the asbestos is removed, it must be in a sufficiently wet state to reduce the dust emissions to the lowest level possible.

The crew must be provided with special protective clothing that will be laundered by the employer. The crew must be provided with separate change rooms, separate lockers and shower facilities.

The crew must be provided with "Type C" supplied air respirators and thoroughly trained in the proper use and wearing of this type of respirator.

When asbestos is removed, the area must be roped off and only authorized workers allowed to enter. Any authorized workers, who are not performing the asbestos removal but are in the vicinity as supervisors, observers, or bystanders, must be provided with appropriate respiratory protection. The asbestos removal must be scheduled so that the least number of workers are in the general vicinity.

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All removed asbestos must be immediately cleaned up, bagged, labeled and disposed of properly.

All other provisions of the OSHA asbestos standard, i.e. monitoring, must be followed.

The Company must agree to honor any reasonable requests or recommendations of the Union as to priorities for asbestos removal or encapsulation, the training of the removal crew, and the actual removal operation.

This request for asbestos removal is one of the highest priorities of our Union. We therefore request a meeting with you at the earliest possible time in order to get this program underway. At such a meeting, we will be accompanied by various members of the staff of our International Union's Health and Safety Department.

I look forward to hearing from you.
