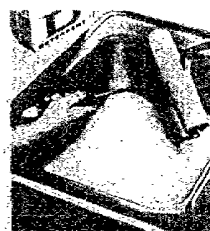

As stadiums go, the most beautiful in the world is San Francisco's Seals—moved in in 1931. Athletics and a constant baseball for comfort fans liked it (except for the only big ball park field, all right; so big home run was hit over plate in right field. Tiring a hazardous occurrence to do with it, too.

Ah, the players' management stayed a step ahead of the major leagues. If talent went up from \$50,000 to \$125,000 and the Yankees paid \$65,000 in 1928, an entire team could be bought for \$135,000—Smead Jolley's bargain of all was the last the Yankees got. Di Maggio.

There were many other players: Ping Bodie, Larry Jant, Gene Woodling, Curt Gowdy, 11 pennants, the last in 1918.

Built at a cost of \$1,000,000, the stadium now is valued at a good deal more to major league Giants, Candlestick Park. It is a scenic spot in America.
