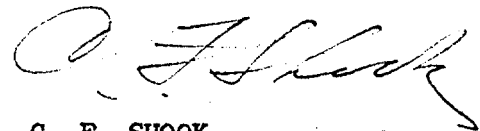
My dear Dr. Kehoe:
