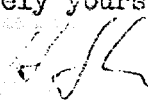
Dear Dr. Heyroth:

As you undoubtedly know, we are considering a large development program aimed at the commercialization of the compound AP-3 (formerly designated as APR-128). In the course of this work, we will need to establish ICC shipping regulations for this material.

Consequently, under separate cover Dr. Sugimoto is shipping you 0.5 lb. of neat AP-3 and about one quart of bottoms from the rectifying column in Detroit. Dr. Witherup has seen and discussed the latter material with Detroit personnel. This material is believed to contain toxic organic manganese compounds of unidentified composition to which personnel may be exposed.

At present, we are shipping AP-3 from Orangeburg to Detroit labeled as a Class B poison. Since we expect the number and size of such shipments to increase considerably, we would appreciate your conducting the necessary tests to establish shipping regulations at an early date.
