 Clerk written objection to the things pro-
 posed to be done, the extent of the
 proposed District, of both.
 Notice is further given that said
 time and place are also fixed by
 said Resolution No. 10, adopted
 a line April 18, 1962, and are hereby fixed,
 block, as the time and place when and
 where any and all persons inter-
 ested may appear, and show cause.
 Street if any they have, why said Council
 should not find and determine that
 the public convenience and necessity
 require said proposed acquisitions
 and improvements without compli-
 ing with said Special Assessment
 Investigation Limitation and Majority

 is of interest, owning or having an in-

 the signature of the objector, con-
 taining a description of his property,
 stating a statement of the nature of his in-
 terest therein and a statement of the
 nature of his objection. If no objec-
 tions are filed, as provided herein-
 above, or when said objections have
 been heard and overruled, the Coun-
 cil may adopt a resolution finding
 and determining that public conveni-
 ence and necessity require the pro-
 posed acquisitions and improvements
 and that the Special Assessment In-
 vestigation, Limitation and Majority
 Point of Protest Act of 1931 shall not apply.
 Said resolution shall be adopted by
 no less than a four-fifths (4-5) vote
 of all members of the Council and its
 findings and determinations shall be
 final and conclusive.
 12. The City Clerk is hereby di-
 rected, in the time, form and man-
 ner required by law (including said
 Vehicle Parking District Law of
 1943), (a) to cause this Ordinance
 to be published in the MONTEREY
 PENINSULA HERALD; (b) to post
 or cause to be posted copies of this
 Ordinance; and (c) to mail, postage
 prepaid, a copy of this Ordinance to
 each person in whose land in said
 proposed District is assessed as
 shown on the last equalized county
 assessment roll, at his address as
 shown upon the roll and to any
 person, whether owner in fee hav-
 ing a lien upon, or legal or equitable
 interest in, any land within the Dis-
 trict, whose name and address and
 a designation of the land in which he
 is interested is on file in the of-
 fice of the Clerk, or as otherwise
 required by law.
