Dear Professor Kehoe,

It was very pleasant to hear from you again with your letter of 25th July, 1960.

Mr. John Batchelor is going to London this week and I have obtained the information from our consultants in the various States here that the health authorities will have no objection to the marketing of the petrol containing T.M.L. as well as T.E.L.

Our consultants have received some literature about T.M.L., but we do not have any available to give the health authorities, though apparently they are quite happy about this aspect of the problem. Mr. Batchelor has informed me that, at first at least, it is intended to replace ten per cent of the T.E.L. in petrol with T.M.L.

I think that some of the health authorities may have tried to obtain further information about T.M.L. from some of the oil companies, but I am not sure of this. I shall write to our other consultants and tell them that so far as the various oil companies are concerned this information should be treated as strictly confidential. I do not think that any of them know anything as to which companies will be marketing this petrol in the near future.
