Dear Mr. Milne:

The various reports forwarded to me from your office and that of Mr. Willis were returned in one package to Mr. Willis on May 4. I fear that I should have returned those listed in your letter of April 14 to you, but it seemed simplest to deal with all of the material through Mr. Willis. I'm sorry that this seems to have resulted in some delay and inconvenience to you.
