The Superintendent of Documents is the official sales agency for U S Government publications. Much of the material published by federal agencies can be purchased through this office, official catalogs and indexes are available. The Government Printing Office was created by Congressional Joint Resolution, June 23, 1860, to print public documents.

Of prime interest to safety professionals is Price List No 78, "Social Services," which lists available government publications on these and related subjects. Also available is the biweekly "Selected List of United States Government Publications." This list, now distributed free of charge to more than

1,000,000 people, provides an excellent way to learn of new publications as they are printed.

Interstate Commerce Commission

The ICC was created as an independent establishment by the Act to Regulate Commerce of February 4, 1887. Subsequent legislation has strengthened its authority and broadened the scope of its jurisdiction. In 1967, responsibility for automotive, railroad, and pipeline safety was transferred to the Department of Transportation (which see).

In addition to regulating rates, routes, service, and schedules of rail carriers, motor carriers, water carriers, pipelines, and freight forwarders, the ICC establishes through routes and joint rates between carriers, has jurisdiction over use and movement of locomotives and cars, arranges for pooling or division of traffic, service, or earnings of carriers, and passes upon all consolidations, unifications, acquisitions, and mergers or carriers under its jurisdiction.

The ICC prescribes uniform systems of accounting and depreciation, regulates the form and storage requirements of bills of lading and records, requires both routine and special statistical and financial reports, and can look at the accounts and records of carriers under its jurisdiction. The commission requires posting of all rates and regulations, and can suspend proposed rates, pending hearings. It can order a common carrier to make reparation for damage sustained by reason of violation of the ICC Act. It authorizes issuance of securities, administers railroad bankruptcies, and watches for antitrust activities.

The commission develops national emergency plans and preparedness programs covering motor, rail, and inland water carriers.
