Dear Doctor Kehoe:

I apologize for the delay in sending you the manuscript on the Versenate treatment of children with lead poisoning. I had to exert great pressure on the young men to write their manuscript. I wonder whether investigators pay sufficient attention to the use of good oxidation procedures in the analysis for lead.

I am adding the story of an interesting case of an adult who was treated with Versenate. You may be especially interested in looking at the chart on page six. We think that the drug should be given intermittently, and I will report to you as soon as I have enough material to show advantages or disadvantages.

One of my co-workers, Dr. Fredric Hieders, has made an interesting study comparing the effects of BAL and of EDTA which he will present at the next Federation meeting.
