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PRODUCT INFORMATION QUESTIONNAIRE

(Supplemental Information to Material Safety Data Sheet)

Manufacturer's Name: UNION CARBIDE CORPORATION

In addition to the information requested on the Material Safety Data Sheet, we would appreciate receiving information regarding the items listed below. We realize that in some instances, a complete answer may involve proprietary information that you may not wish to divulge. In such cases, it is understandable that you may wish to reply in general terms.

1. Q. What heavy metals does the product contain, if any, and do they present a health hazard:

A. Trace amounts of water in soluble lead, chromium, and nickel. These are not known to present a health hazard.

2. Q. Has the substance been tested for skin and eye irritation and what are the results of these studies? (Please indicate the species tested, and the Draize score obtained unless other testing methods were employed.)

A. The substance has not been tested for skin and eye irritation. It should be considered as a nuisance dust.

3. Q. Has the substance ever caused skin sensitization or been tested for skin sensitization ability? Please summarize the results of tests on this subject.

A. We have had no reports of skin sensitization. The substance has not been tested in this regard.

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4. Q. Does any evidence exist to suspect an adverse physiologic effect as a result of chronic exposure to this compound?

A. There is evidence that chronic and extended exposure to levels above the allowable TLV may cause serious damage to the lungs.

5. Q. Is the material registered with the Food and Drug Administration, and if it is regulated by the Food Additive Amendment, which specific regulation (Code of Federal Regulations) controls its use?

A. The material is registered by the FDA and can be used in materials in contact with food as follows:
