We are enclosing a photostat of our Confidential Report 16-52, dated May 21, 1953, The Sub-acute Oral Toxicity of Polyvinyl Ethyl Ether (EXEM). Copies of the protocol are not included, as they are not essential. It is quite evident, since 10 per cent of this material in the diet of rats (amounting to 10.4 grams per kilogram body weight per day) had no effect, that this product is of a very low order of oral toxicity.

Since the attached report is unpublished data, we would appreciate your assurance that it will not be reproduced. If we may be of further service, please do not hesitate to let us know.
