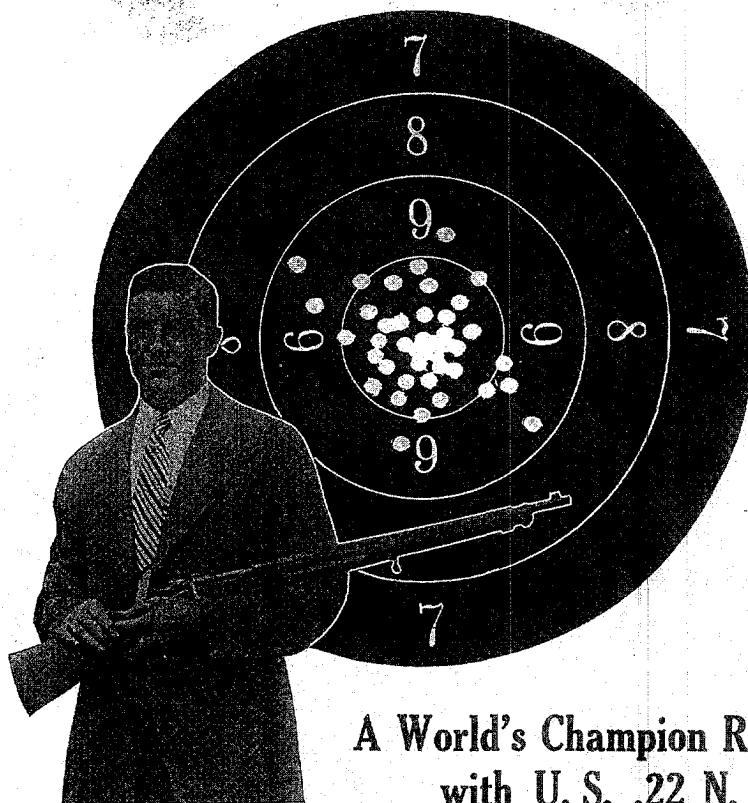




A World's Champion Repeats with U. S. .22 N. R. A.'s

FOR the second time in his medaled career "Larry" Nuesslein, of Washington, D. C., is the world's champion small-bore shot. And both times he won the title with U. S. .22 N. R. A.'s—first at the 1920 Olympics and this year at the International Rifle Matches, Rome, Italy.

Above is a composite of the championship targets shot from the standing position by Nuesslein at Rome. Score: 394 x 400. Nuesslein also placed second at Rome in the small-bore re-entry.
