A. P. TRADE GAINS
"Since 1921 San Francisco has advanced from eleventh to seventh place in volume of trade conducted through its ports of the United States. It has increased the volume of traffic through the port 25 per cent, from 2,100,000 tons in 1921 to 2,600,000 tons in 1927."
"Foreign competitors recognize the importance and future of trade between the Pacific Coast and European ports and have shown their confidence by establishing lines and building new tonnage to meet the requirements of the service."
"No Americans are operating in this trade."
"Present and future possibilities of the service are sufficient to warrant the most careful investigation."
QUICK ACTION URGED
"American interests should go in now before our foreign competitors become too firmly established. Trade between the Pacific Coast and European ports increased almost 80 per cent from 1922 to 1927, inclusive."
The Merchant Marine Act of 1920 is intended to help the West Coast as well as the East Coast, and it will help both when it is intelligently used by far-sighted shipping men."

New Proposals For Amendments

Possibility that more than twenty proposed charter amendments will be placed on the November ballot was indicated yesterday when several new suggestions were placed before the judiciary committee of the Board of Supervisors.
Among those who made requests were Supervisor Reinhardt, Probation Officer J. E. Albrecht and Police Judge Daniel E. O'Brien. Reinhardt proposed that only four instead of seven members of the school board be appointed by the Mayor, the remaining three to be selected by the Board of Supervisors.
Albrecht asked for an amendment bringing the probation department under the civil service, and Judge O'Brien asked for one empowering the board to raise the salaries of police judges.

Man, \$2000 Missing. Police Start Hunt

Pete Kannel, an officer of the steam schooner Horace Baxter, was saved from drowning at 3 o'clock yesterday morning when he fell overboard near the slip of the ferry Alameda. Patrolman John J. McLaughlin of Harbor Station, attracted to the scene when he heard the splash, dived overboard and clung to him until members of the ferry crew went to the rescue.
