Hello,

I am **fact-checking** a short piece about coral-safe sunscreens for the January/February 2018 issue of AAA Washington's magazine, *Journey*.

First, am I correct that it would be in the EPA's purview to set standards on ingredients in sunscreens related to environmental impacts? If so, I'm hoping to confirm two things:

1. Currently there are no standards set by the EPA for sunscreens claiming to be "coral safe" or "reef safe." Accurate?
2. No standards for "coral safe" or "reef safe" sunscreens are anticipated in the near future—at least through February of 2018. Accurate?
