Called 'Ridiculous' by Oilman

Arthur Cameron, Through Attorney, Denies
Actress' Charges of Fraudulent Marriage

"Entirely ridiculous" was the description oilman Arthur Cameron and his attorney, Arthur Crowley, had Thursday for actress Ann Miller's \$7,150,000 "fraudulent marriage" suit against Cameron.

Miss Miller, 38, alleges in her suit filed Wednesday in Santa Monica Superior Court that she and the 61-year-old oil millionaire were married May 25, 1960, in a ceremony in Mexico City "before numerous witnesses." She contends they separated last March 7.

"They were never married, they were only engaged," Crowley said flatly. "And, in this state, you can no longer sue anyone for breach of promise."

Denies Any Ceremony

The attorney said Cameron denies any Mexico City ceremony.

"If they were married last May," asked Crowley, "why did she hold a big party just last Oct. 27 to announce her engagement?"

Women who attended the big luncheon party confirmed Miss Miller used the occasion to announce her engagement. It was held at

Cameron's house on Benedict Canyon Rd.

Crowley insisted that Cameron and Miss Miller have never lived together as man and wife.

"He stayed at his place in Benedict Canyon and she stayed at her place on Summit Ridge Dr.," the lawyer asserted.

Miss Miller obtained the Bel-Air house as part of her divorce settlement last May 12 from William P. Moss, wealthy Texas oilman. In that divorce proceeding, Crowley represented the actress.

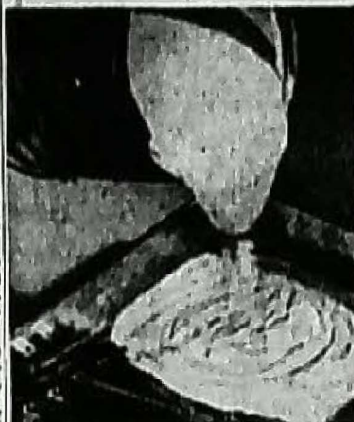
Miss Miller was first wed to Reese L. Milner, investment broker, from January, 1946 to February, 1947.

Encino High-Rise Project Approved

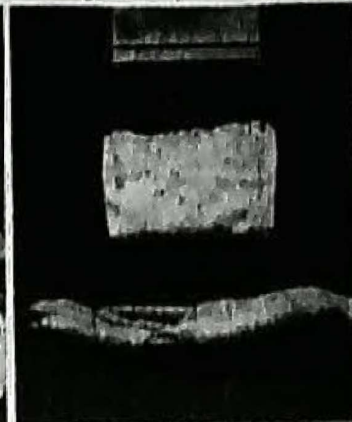
A \$25 million high-rise apartment development in Encino was approved, 3-1, Thursday by the City Planning Commission.

If final approval is granted by the City Council, builder Robert D. Silver said he plans a 10 to 13-story structure at Magnolia and Balboa Divs.

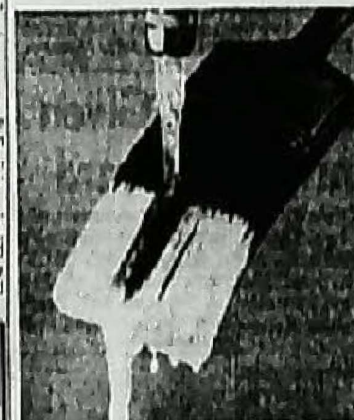
