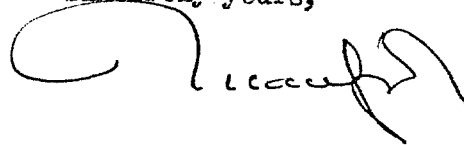
Dear Bob:

I believe that you will be glad to know that I have word from Washington that it was decided at the meeting of the Federal Specifications Board yesterday to make no change in the specification referred to in my letter of February 12, pending the outcome of the tests now to be undertaken.

Backing accorded to the proposal for modification without supporting data had made this more than a possibility, and there can be no question that your opinion and those of your seven colleagues, variously expressing the thoughts so well put in the enclosed, were a most important counter-vailing influence.

Plans for the forthcoming tests will now be drawn up. Any suggestions beyond those already received, looking toward making them as complete and conclusive as possible, will be most welcome.
