and cigarettes, cosmetics, phonograph records, photographic films and equipment, watches and clocks, electric light bulbs, telephone and telegraph service, not to mention larger items of expenditures such as musical instruments, sporting goods, jewelry, and luggage. Some notion of how large the toll is that is taken by taxes out of the family's income can be gathered from contemplation of the estimate that something like \$56 a year is what the average car owner will pay in motor vehicle taxes of various kinds. The amount paid out by taxpayers in federal taxes alone has increased by nearly 700% since 1940, and runs to the astounding figure of \$5.80, approximately, per average person in the population (including children and adults) per week, or about \$22 per week per average family. To this figure, of course, must be added an additional amount for various state, municipal, and local taxes; this relatively small proportion of the total provides the evident and very substantial benefits of police protection, fire protection, street cleaning and other sanitary services, garbage collection, hospitals, schools, and libraries. For all of these services, including special services to business and to agriculture, control of food and drugs and of weights and measures, and many others, state and local governments collect only one-fifth the amount absorbed by the federal government's tax collections.

Reduction of personal income taxes, a step most vigorously opposed by the Administration, would undoubtedly be a factor in reducing costs and prices. Only the expenditure-conscious person and persons in the surtax income brackets are fully aware of the amount of wages or salary they contribute to the support of the
