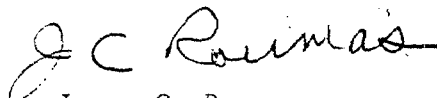
Dear Colleague:

Enclosed for your information is a reprint of the article "An International Study of 'Normal' Levels of Lead in Blood and Urine" which appeared in the July 1967 issue of the Archives of Environmental Health. This is being sent to you because we feel it will be of interest to you in your work.

Of special interest among the findings of this 16-country study is that the average lead levels in the blood of New Guinea aborigines, who lived away from industrialization and motorization, were comparable with those of persons living in industrialized countries. This study and other recent investigations showed that lead levels in human blood and urine have not changed significantly during the past three decades.
