Inventory Adjustment

At the request of Mr. Hague, I am pleased to advise that after reviewing your inventory in the same general way as I have all other manufacturing units of the Institution, I find only a very few items appearing in the inventory at a cost higher than the August 1st market.

These apparently are the small remaining amounts of Titanium and Zinc Sulphide pigments which were purchased prior to the decline in price which became effective July 1st. Many of these items, and your Lithopons, appear in the inventory at the current market price. I have extracted these items as per the attached memorandum and suggested to Mr. Reese's office that the adjustment should be \$85.88, a negligible amount but an entry is put through merely to keep in line with our general policy of inventorying all products "at cost or market, whichever is lower".
