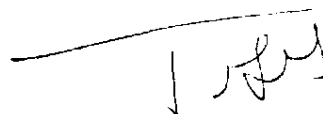

failure to install guardrails at all open-sides and ends of a scaffold (No. 87-1029).

Fab Plumbing Co. Inc., Oak Lawn, Ill., is contesting a serious citation and a \$400 penalty for 1926.404(b)(1)(i) for failure to use an assured grounding program, and 1926.405(a)(2)(ii)(J) for failure to use a proper extension cord (No. 87-1006).

Field Rhode Island Inc., Wauregan, Conn., is contesting a serious citation and a \$2,500 penalty for four items, including Section 5(a)(1) for failure to protect employees from the hazard of being exposed to rotating concrete mixer paddles while having their body within a concrete mixing machine, 1910.219(d)(1) for failure to guard pulleys, and 1910.219(f)(1) for failure to enclose gears on a concrete mixer.

The employer also is contesting a non-serious citation and a \$100 penalty for 1903.2(a)(1) for failure to post an OSHA notice (No. 87-1014).

Frost Co., Kenosha, Wis., is contesting a willful citation and a \$5,000 penalty for 1910.1025(c)(1) for failure to monitor employees for excessive levels of lead, and 1910.1025(e)(1) for failure to implement controls to reduce lead levels.

The employer also is contesting a repeat citation and a \$2,000 penalty for 1910.95(b)(1) for failure to implement controls to reduce noise levels.

The employer also is contesting a serious citation and a \$1,100 penalty for four items, including 1910.1025(h)(1) for failure to keep a work area free of lead, 1910.1025(i)(4)(ii) for failure to provide a temperature-controlled filtered air supply in a lunch room, and 1910.1025(i)(4)(iv) for failure to have employees remove lead dust from clothing prior to entering lunch room facilities (No. 87-1008).

General Drywall Co. Wickliffe, Ohio, is contesting a serious citation and a \$440 penalty for 1926.100(a) for failure to wear head protection, and 1926.550(b)(2) for failure to repair mechanical deficiencies on a truck crane (No. 87-1003).

The Gerstenslager Co., Wooster, Ohio, is contesting a willful citation and a \$9,000 penalty for 1910.217(f)(4) for failure to operate power presses within weight ratings specified by the manufacturer (No. 87-1004).

J.L. Harris & Associates Inc., Jeffersonton, Ky., is contesting a serious citation and a \$990 penalty for 1926.25(a) for failure to keep trash from the floor, and 1926.500(d)(1) for failure to install guardrails.

The employer also is contesting a non-serious citation for 1926.350(j) for failure to store oxygen and acetylene cylinders at least 20 feet apart (No. 87-1005).

Hemmerle Construction Co., Fort Lauderdale, Fla., is contesting a serious citation and a \$2,940 penalty for seven items, including 1926.25(a) for failure to keep trash from the floor, 1926.105(a) for failure to provide safety nets, and 1926.450(a)(10) for failure to secure a ladder (No. 87-1039).

Hinchcliff Lumber Co., Persons, W.Va., is contesting a notification of failure to abate and a \$1,800 penalty for 1910.95(b)(1) for failure to implement controls to reduce noise levels (No. 87-1025).

K&K Commercial Constructors, San Antonio, Texas, is contesting a serious citation and a \$1,010 penalty for 1926.20(b)(2) for failure to perform safety inspections, 1926.21(b)(2) for failure to properly install wood roof trusses, and 1926.100(a) for failure to wear protective helmets.

The employer also is contesting a non-serious citation for six items, including 1903.2(a)(1) for failure to post an OSHA notice, 1926.50(b) failure to provide first aid personnel prior to beginning a construction project, and 1926.150(a)(1) for failure to develop a fire protection program for all phases of a construction project (No. 87-1021).

Lynn Sign Moulded Plastic Co. Inc., Merrimac, Mass., is contesting a serious citation and a \$240 penalty for 1910.212(a)(3)(ii) for failure to guard a blade on the lower part of a saw (No. 87-1051).

Lynn Sign Moulded Plastic Co. Inc., Merrimac, Mass., is contesting a serious citation and a \$120 penalty for 1910.212(a)(5) for failure to guard an exhaust fan, and 1910.219(d)(1) for failure to guard the pulley and belt on an exhaust fan (No. 87-1052).

Marek Brothers Systems Inc., Houston, Texas, is contesting a repeat citation and a \$1,000 penalty for 1903.2(a)(1) for failure to post an OSHA notice (No. 87-1017).

Nabisco Brands Inc., Biscuit Division, Chicago, Ill., is contesting a serious citation and a \$420 penalty for 1910.22(a)(2) for failure to keep work room floors dry (No. 87-1009).

New Brunswick Roofing & Metal Co., South Plainfield, N.J., is contesting a serious citation and a \$120 penalty for 1926.500(g)(5) for failure to use fall protection (No. 87-1033).

Frank Novak & Sons Inc., Cleveland, Ohio, is contesting a serious citation and a \$280 penalty for 1926.105(a) for failure to provide fall protection (No. 87-1047).

Otis Elevator of Miami, Miami, Fla., is contesting a serious citation and a \$1,200 penalty for 1926.105(a) for failure to provide safety nets, and 1926.21(b)(2) for failure to instruct employees to wear safety equipment (No. 87-1037).

Oxen Companies Inc., Tomball, Texas, is contesting a serious citation and a \$200 penalty for 1926.700(b)(1) for failure to provide safety belts (No. 87-1016).

Henry Paul Inc., Woodside, N.Y., is contesting a repeat citation and a \$360 penalty for 1926.404(b)(1)(i) for failure to use an assured equipment grounding conductor program (No. 87-1030).

RCA Rubber Co., Akron, Ohio, is contesting a serious citation and a \$660 penalty for 1910.106(e)(2)(iv)(c) for failure to use flammable liquids where ignition was not possible, 1910.212(a)(3)(ii) for failure to guard point of operation on machinery, and 1910.212(a)(5) failure to provide fan blade guards (No. 87-1002).

Richard W. Reid Electrical Co. Inc., Woburn, Mass., is contesting a serious citation and a \$280 penalty for 1926.652(b) for failure to provide a shoring system in a trench (No. 87-1050).

J. Richard Industries, Toledo, Ohio, is contesting a serious citation and a \$420 penalty for 1910.95(b)(1) for failure to implement controls to reduce sound levels.

The employer also is contesting a non-serious citation for 1910.95(i)(3) for failure to allow employees to select hearing protectors (No. 87-1048).

Richardson Associates Inc., Naperville, Ill., is contesting a serious citation and a \$160 penalty for 1926.450(a)(2) for failure to repair defective ladders, 1926.450(a)(10) for failure to secure portable ladders, and 1926.500(b)(2) for failure to provide guardrails at a ladderway opening (No. 87-1044).
