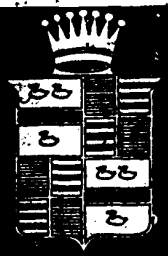

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Symphony Season Will Open Friday

Alfred Herz will conduct the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra Friday afternoon at the Curran Theater in the opening concert of the 1929-30 season. Interest is centered in the great tone poem, "Zarathustra," by Richard Strauss, which will be an outstanding feature of the program.

"Zarathustra" has never been heard here.

In addition to "Zarathustra" the opening concert of the season will present two other works never heard before, a "Sinfonia" in B Flat Major by Johann Christian Bach, and the Symphony No. 4 by Alexander Glazounov. The entire program will be repeated on Sunday afternoon at the Curran Theater.

Tide Balks Hunt for Body of Drowned Boy

Not until today is there any hope of recovering the body of Richard Lindner, 12, of 218 Naylor street, who was swept to his death in Halfmoon bay while fishing last Sunday with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. R. Lindner. With a strong offshore wind and a heavy tide running, Manuel Dutra, deputy coroner at Halfmoon Bay, and Constable Fred Simmons were forced yesterday to call off the search for the body. Hundreds of volunteers patrolled the beaches, including the father and mother.

Legislative Street Committee to Meet

The joint committee of State Senators and Assemblymen created by the last Legislature to study the street improvement laws of California, particularly the so-called Matson act, will meet in the State building here Friday. Assemblyman Clare Woolwine of Los Angeles, chairman of the committee, empowered Senator Daniel C. Murphy of this city to make all necessary arrangements for the meeting and a public hearing in connection thereof.

Dunkards to Send Japan Missionary

For the first time in the history of the Church of the Brethren, known as the Dunkards, it is to send a missionary to Japan. Dr. Rio Takemae, Japanese educator and prominent member of the faith, who is en route home following six years of study in Europe, told the Travelers' Aid Society about it yesterday. The missionary is Earl W. Roop of Seattle, formerly a Colorado teacher, and Dr. Takemae leaves tomorrow to visit him and arrange for Roop's reception in Japan next year.

Death of Club Cook : Pronounced Suicide

George David, 50, a cook at the University Club, Powell and California streets, was found dead in his room at a hotel at 619 Larkin street yesterday morning, a kitchen knife in his breast. He had told friends recently that he was tired of living and he had been in poor health for some time. The body was discovered when he failed to appear for work at the club and the hotel was called by his employers. Deputy Coroner Tony Trabucco pronounced the case one of suicide.
