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UNWANTED RESCUE HALTS DEEP QUARRY SWIM OF 2 YOUTHS

BERKELEY, May 19.—Unquestionably it was an ideal day for swimming, and the water at the bottom of an abandoned quarry at the head of La Loma Avenue appeared particularly inviting.

But Harry W. Elliot, 18, of 1145 Amador Street, and Ferdinand R. Minnas, 18, of 1540 Shattuck Avenue, reckoned not with residents of the district who have seen too many youths pulled to safety from the steep walls of the quarry.

Before they were able to reach the waters edge, fire and police cars roared up and firemen let down a 150-foot rope to haul them back to the crest. They grabbed the end, although insisting they didn't need the help, and were pulled back.

Convinced of their error, the pair headed for a park pool.

Crane Hits Charged Wire, Kills Worker

RICHMOND, May 19.—James Blake, 35, slingman at Richmond Shipyard No. 2, was killed today as he attempted to unload steel from a crane which had contacted a high-tension wire.

Another workman, Carl Beck, was knocked unconscious, but was revived 10 minutes later.

Berkeley Allotted 1560 Steel Helmets

Berkeley has been allotted 1560 steel helmets from a consignment of 40,000 to be shipped to California in the near future, according to word received from the State Council of Defense at Sacramento.

Of the total, 27,970 will go to Los Angeles and 12,190 to San Francisco.

Additional helmets probably will be allocated to California cities, council officials said, but no accurate information as to size or time of shipment has been received.

Youth Kidnap Case In Hands of Jury

A jury which heard the case of Harry Sal Blasquez, 19, charged with two counts each of kidnapping and attempted assault, postponed deliberations until after lunch today when no agreement could be reached at the end of two hours.

The case has been in the court of Superior Judge Edward J. Tyrrell since last Wednesday. It went to the jury of five women and seven men at 10:28 a.m.

Blasquez is charged with knocking down two sisters, Clara, 23, and Fay Livingston, 27, as they rode their bicycles along a Hayward street last March 4.

After stopping and offering to take them to a hospital for treatment, it is alleged he drove them to Crow Canyon and attempted to assault them. One girl escaped and stopped a passing motorist who took the girls to a hospital.

Compromise Sought In Grocery Strike

SACRAMENTO, May 19.—(UP)—Federal Conciliator Stanley V. White today hoped to end a dispute between Sacramento grocery store employers and striking clerks which closed most of the food markets yesterday.

With both fractions agreeable to submit the stalemate to Federal conciliation, White called a meeting for this afternoon. The expected compromise will be acted upon tonight at a meeting of the clerks union and it was predicted the stores would be reopened tomorrow.

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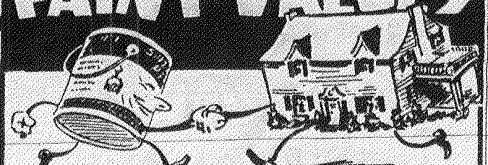
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
