Dear Mr. Mittnacht:

On receipt of your telegram today, I dispatched to you the remainder of the copies of Rules and Regulations which are in this office. I take it that our total supply of these has now been exhausted and that it will be necessary to issue a new set. I have made certain modifications which are for the most part in the nature of simplification of wording. I will send the new copy in to you just as soon as we can set it up in finished form. I had hoped to be able to decide definitely whether anything should be said about lead accumulations in tank cars etc., before the issuance of the new set of rules. I am not now in position to do this since we are still collecting information on the subject. Consequently I think it advisable to say nothing about this subject in the new copy. Such evidence as we have seems to indicate that this is not a particularly important matter and I do not wish to introduce any un-necessary material into these Rules and Regulations.

In view of the above intentions, I would suggest that you do not have any additional copies of the Rules and Regulations reprinted, but that you make use of the new copy in the issuance of a new set of the regulations.
