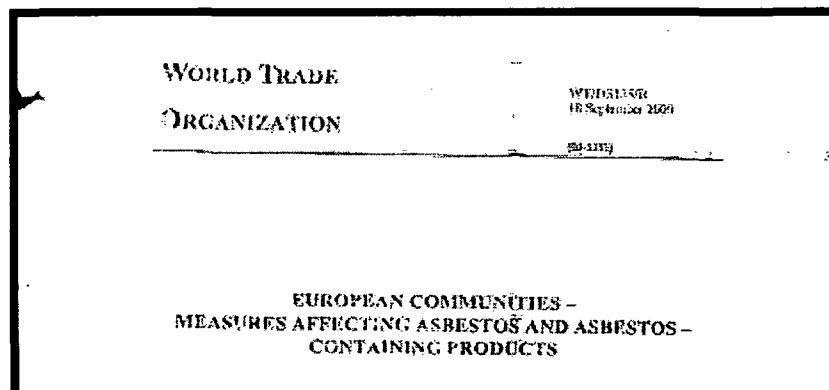


World Trade Organization, *European Communities—Measures Affecting Asbestos and Asbestos-Containing Products*, 2000



Dr. Douglas Henderson:

“When one is faced with multiple exposures to asbestos, the following points emerge, specifically for mesothelioma induction, provided that the characteristics and time for each exposure are appropriate for a biological effect: (i) it is not valid to point to one exposure among the others and incriminate it as the sole cause of a mesothelioma, with exoneration of the other exposures; (ii) it is not valid to point to one exposure and exonerate it from a causative role in the development of a mesothelioma, and to incriminate all the others . . . In such circumstances, it is not the presence or absence of an effect that is in question, but the magnitude of each effect in proportion to the others.”
