hauled six months ago a wonder drug against tuberculosis, lost some of its glamor today. In reports to the National Tuberculosis Association.

Dr. Ross L. McLean, of the Veterans Administration Hospital at Baltimore, announced the abandonment of sanatoria alone as a TB treatment in his institution but said its use would be continued in combination with other drugs.

This was done after a study of nearly 5,000 cases. Dr. Paul Chapman, of Herman Kiefer Hospital, Detroit, reported nearly identical results against the disease with three different drug combinations—isoniazid alone, isoniazid with the antibiotic streptomycin, and streptomycin with para-aminosalicylic acid. This last combination has been widely used with good results.

Dr. J. Burns Amberson of New York City said one of the problems is the shortage of hospital beds for tuberculosis patients. Hospitalization is the preferred method of treatment, he said, but the number of unhospitalized patients is increasing.

New Planes Don't Mean Mail Hike For Southwest

WASHINGTON (U. S. Civil Aeronautics Board has told Southwest Airways that use of Martin 202 planes will not qualify it for higher mail pay.

The board issued an order yesterday proposing to reduce Southwest's mail pay by approximately \$110,000 a year, based on operations with T-3 aircraft exclusively.

Southwest, the board said, acquired four Martin 202's in late 1952, put two of them into service between Los Angeles and San Francisco April 26, and plan to put a third into service between San Francisco and Medford, Ore.

The CAB called the 202 operations "a matter of managerial discretion and responsibility." They "are being undertaken as a risk of management," the order added, "and any need for mail pay subsidy in addition to that required for operations with DC-3's will not be underwritten."

Southwest submitted figures showing it would need \$244,000 a year (more mail pay above that required for exclusive DC-3 operations) if two Martin planes were used, and \$233,000 more if three Martin aircraft were taken into account.

TEXAS CITY, Tex. (UP)—A sharp explosion and brief flash fire last night jarred the Monsanto Chemical Co. plant on the Texas City waterfront where one of the nation's worst disasters killed more than 550 persons in April, 1947.

Wary Texas City authorities turned in a general alarm and every ambulance and fire truck and most policemen were rushed to the fire.

But this time it was all over within 30 minutes—the fire extinguished by the plant's automatic fire fighting equipment. No one was hurt.

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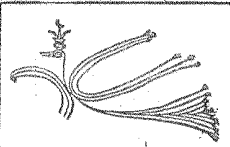
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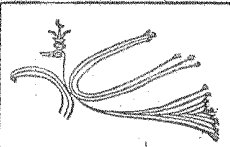
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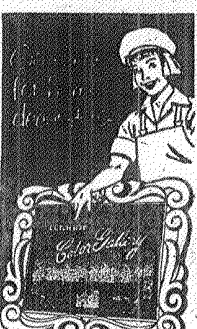
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
