5 MR. IGNATOWSKI: Asbestos exposure of brake

12 Brake linings pose a potential hazard for
13 asbestos exposure because they contain 33 to 73
14 percent asbestos.

15 During brake lining servicing, the wheel is
16 removed, all loose dust is removed from the drums and
17 back plates. Compressed air jets are usually used.

18 Alternates include vacuuming and wet
19 brushing. The brake lining itself may require
20 grinding to remove irregularities or removal and
21 replacement.
