Contamination In Plant Blaze

DENVER (U.P.) — Federal officials were quick to report yesterday that a fire in the Rocky Flats Atomic Plant northwest of Denver resulted in "no spread of radioactive" contamination of any consequence.

But it was noon before they reported the fire itself. They said it occurred late Wednesday night and early yesterday, causing \$50,000 damages.

Seth Woodruff, plant manager, said there was "possibly" some spread of radioactivity from the fire, but it was so slight it could not be detected immediately on the radioactive equipment at the plant.

Dow Chemical Corporation operates the plant for the Atomic Energy Commission. The government never has revealed the plant's purpose.

U. S. Treasury Plans To Borrow \$3 Billion

WASHINGTON (A) — The Treasury said today it plans to borrow about three billion dollars on an assortment of long and short term securities, all carrying a 4 percent interest rate.

A Treasury spokesman said the borrowing would push the national debt to within a half a billion dollars of the legal limit of 275 billion dollars at the end of this month. It now stands at just over 273 billion, but about two billion of this will be paid off by Oct. 1.

Britain Proposes Easing of Travel Rules

MOSCOW (A) — Britain has proposed that she and Russia drop restrictions on travel of each other's diplomats. But if the Soviet government doesn't relax travel bans on Britons, Britain warned she may tighten up on Russian diplomats.

Ambassador Sir Patrick Reilly handed the Soviet Foreign Ministry a note yesterday. It was similar to an offer of more liberal travel rules for diplomats made to Russia several months ago by the United States. No action has been taken on the U. S. proposal.
