MCCARTHY MADE MANAGER OF TRADE SALES

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Reported Lost in Action

Harry E. Perry, St. Louis branch employee who enlisted in the Navy last September, has been reported lost in action in the Atlantic. He was 36 years old and leaves a wife and five children.

Mr. Perry joined the St. Louis Lead & Oil Works in 1926. Leaving in 1933, he returned in 1937 and had been employed continuously until his enlistment.

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Killed in Plane Crash

Second Lieutenant Virgil L. Elevins, who left the St. Louis branch in February, 1941, to join the Army Air Corps, was killed in a plane crash near Great Falls, S.C. on Jan. 23. Lieutenant Elevins, a bombing plane pilot, was 23 years old. In addition to his parents, he is survived by his wife whom he married last December.
