As you know, we are proceeding with our experiments on what comes out of the tailpipe of an automobile as far as lead is concerned pretty much along the lines that were indicated in the reports we forwarded you sometime ago.

As you know, we are very eager to get your opinion on these experiments and to see what other experiments we could do that might be helpful to you. With this in mind, we are still casting around to see what kind of bait we might find that would induce you to come up here and talk about them.
