Dear Doctor Kehoe:

I obtained urine and blood specimens this morning on two employees of Department ABS. These are second specimens of blood and urine on [REDACTED] and a second specimen of urine plus blood on [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was transferred out of this area, at our request, on April 29th. [REDACTED] has been at home, being treated by her local physician since April 9th.

[REDACTED] has improved symptomatically since leaving her job, but still has her head tremor and tremor of the hands. The lead line in her mouth is unchanged. Laboratory examination reveals a drop in the red count and hemoglobin and a marked increase in the stippling.

[REDACTED] is asymptomatic at present. She herself offers the comment that she feels better since she is working in a cleaner area. Her laboratory examination reveals:
