Parents will study bus problem in Sunnyvale schools

SUNNYVALE — Nine parents have agreed to make a long-term study of Sunnyvale Elementary School District's entire transportation problem.

Their decision grew out of a meeting of school district officials and parents who protested the district's policy of providing one-way bus transportation for kindergarten pupils.

Ralph Mayes, 142 Plaza Dr., will head the committee. Its first meeting, to look over budgets and other transportation data with school officials, is set for Sept. 29 at 8 p.m. in McKinley School.

Thirty-five parents objected to the one-way bus service for kindergartners — to school for those attending the morning session, and from school for those attending in the afternoon.

Administrators contend that all available buses are needed during the noon hour to transport children in the first four grades who are on double session.
