TRANSPORTATION

COLUMBUS is served by American, Delta, Eastern, Lake Central, Piedmont, Trans World and United. From Columbus to Point Pleasant, take Interstate 71 south (ten miles), Route 23 south to Chillicothe (35 miles), Route 35 south, bypassing Gallipolis, crossing the Silver Memorial Bridge and directly north through Point Pleasant on Route 62 to the Pleasant Point Resort, which is five miles from town.

CHARLESTON is served by Allegheny, American, Eastern, Piedmont, and United. Air taxi service to Pleasant Point Resort is available (Aviation, Inc.) with twin engine equipment. 310 Cessna (up to 6 passengers) at \$65.00 one way, Apache (3 passengers) at \$50.00 and Apache (4 passengers) at \$45.00. Driving from Charleston, take Route 60 West to junction with Route 35 (15 miles), Route 35 north to junction with W. Va. Rt. 62, then through Point Pleasant on Route 62 north to the Pleasant Point Resort.

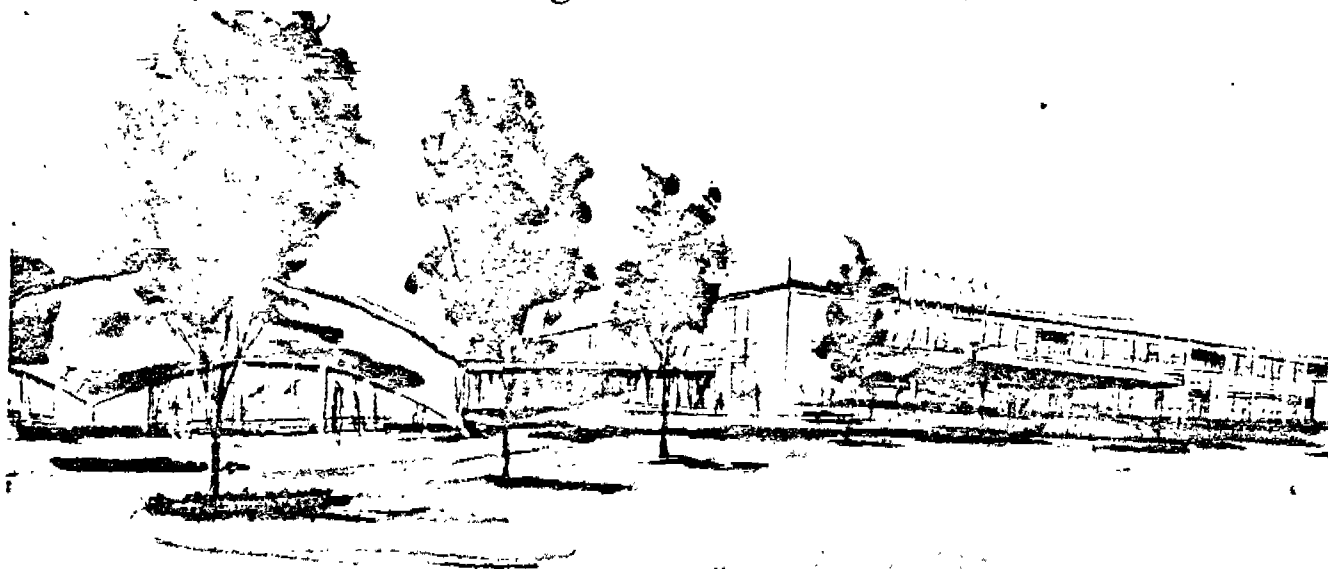
HUNTINGTON is served by Allegheny, Eastern and Piedmont. To drive, go east on Rt. 50 to Seventeenth Street Bridge, cross to Ohio, Route 52, north to Route 7, continue north through Gallipolis to cross the Silver Memorial Bridge and directly through Point Pleasant on Route 62 to the Pleasant Point Resort, five miles north.

X (TRI-STATE AIRPORT)

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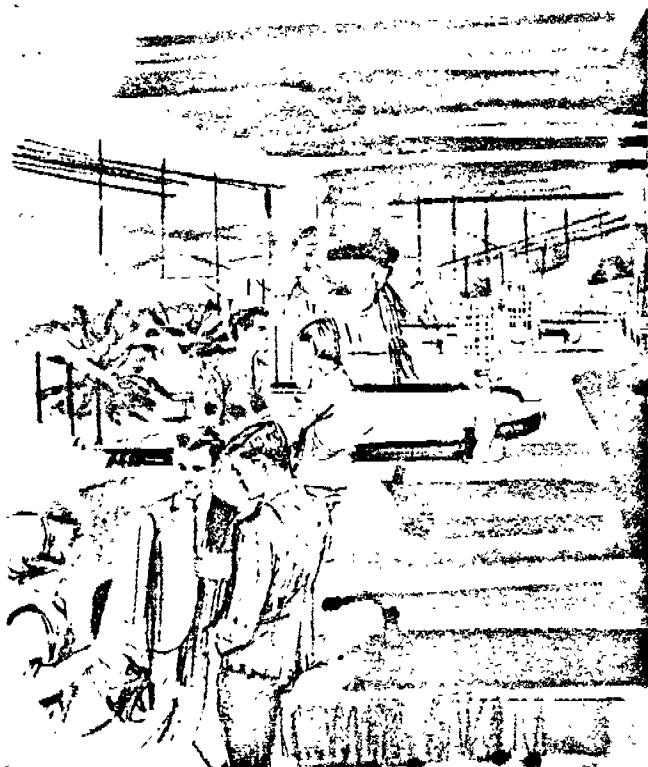

Andrew Lewis defeated a force of Shawnees under the famous Chieftain, Cornstalk. When her husband was killed in this battle, Anne Bailey, "The White Squaw of the Kanawha," clothed herself in the garb of the frontiersman and, as "Mad Anne," set out for vengeance. Daniel Boone, after he lost his holdings in Kentucky, moved to Kanawha County and settled in Point Pleasant in 1788. Here also Captain Peter Joseph Celoron buried four plates, two of which have since been unearthed, claiming the Ohio River, its tributaries, and all lands drained by them for Louis XV, King of France. This strong French influence is still evident in historical homes still standing in nearby Gallipolis, Ohio. ● Tu-Endie-Wei Park in Point Pleasant, only a few minutes drive south from the resort, is a graphic re-creation of these vivid moments in American History. The Park, in addition to offering a splendid view of the Kanawha and Ohio Rivers as they join their waters, contains the Mansion House Museum, a monument commemorating Fort Randolph and the Revolutionary period, and the graves of "Mad Anne" Bailey and Chief Cornstalk. ● Interwoven with the lore of history and scenic splendor is an attractive characteristic of this region—real mountaineer ingenuity and hospitality. Mountaineer culture is everywhere and is enhanced by rural panoramas and brilliant year-round foliage.
