New Demands By Machinists

Members of the A. F. of M. Machinists Union in San Francisco met last night and voted to continue their defiance of a National War Labor Board directive that they must rescind their rule against any man working overtime in any of the 104 local machine shops.

The union took the stand that obedience to the W.L.B. would constitute a complete surrender of the locally organized strength.

NO COERCION... The board, in making its order, said it is not trying to make any man work overtime, but merely is trying to make it possible for any worker who wanted to put in extra hours that might speed victory in the war... "The members don't see any reason for this order and cannot understand it," declared Edward F. Dillon, business agent for the union, Lodge 68.

Dillon and Harry Hook, the local's other business agent, had promised the W.L.B. in Washington, D.C., earlier in the week that they would "use their best efforts" to lift the overtime ban.

REPRESENTATIVE TO COME... Dillon told the members that a representative of the W.L.B. will come to the city area soon to start discussions of the other dispute in which the union is involved. It concerns their refusal to work on new Government "Vessels" for the \$120 rate set for new construction jobs. The local has demanded \$134 an hour, the rate for repair work... The resolution passed at last night's meeting declared there was no work stoppage, no violation of collective bargaining agreements, no violation of a War Manpower Commission edict and no obstruction of the war effort.
