Cable sent to Bevan from Detroit Committee after consultation indicated below

Conversations with Edgson and Kelly - Dealings to open question of unleaded gasoline & distributors as suggested by Bevan. These people are under orders of Government and must do as instructed. They can do as they choose,

arrangements made in U.S.A. with British agreement, was made after attempts to have unleaded gasoline delivered and mixed locally. This was refused on grounds of cost. It was believed to be based purely on lower cost (to British) of unleaded gasoline. He regards this as an attempt to reopen the question and shall leave none of it.
